# The project

The project is defined "artistic" because its conditions don't accomplish, for example with the ones normally required for a scientific or social experiment; nor in regularity neither in precision.

This project aim is to demonstrate how common prejudices can un-objectively affect our capacity to perceive or describe factual reality.

## Materials

Pictures were taken in a south of England environment, mostly Oxfordshire, at given conditions during a period of time, roughly from February 2016 to September 2016. I recently decided to retake project.

#### CONDITIONS:

- Pictures must be taken at the same time of the day, but leaving a two, three days between an image and another.
- The same phone must be used for taking and modify pictures.
- Post-production must be applied (no natural pictures are allowed).
- A doodle on picture marks when all <u>cond</u>itions are accomplished.

### Procedure

Take a picture strictly in open space: every 2 days min. 5 days max strictly at 5 pm.

Post-production effects are applied to highlight the fact of extrinsic artwork and also to stress the instrinsic meaning to show how we can be biased against reality.

Publish on Instagram

Create a webspace to show the <u>ongoing project</u>



For example, through the pictures is possible to observe how weather conditions are not so miserable as common beliefs in the north of Europe.

# Hypothesis
